Advance Export Declaration (AED) with effect from 1 April 2013

Dear TradeNet User,

(1) Introduction:

With effect from 1 April 2013, Singapore Customs (S.C.) requires all declarations to be submitted before the goods are exported, including non-controlled and non-dutiable goods exported by sea and air.

(2) List of AED fields:

Please refer to the list below for the mandatory fields and fields that can be amended under AED. Should there be a need to make changes to any amendable fields, it should be made within the permit validity period. In addition, for fields indicated with an asterisk (*), amendments will be allowed only

if it does not involve controlled/prohibited or dutiable goods.

(3) Adjustment period:

In order to facilitate a company's fine-tuning of operations and processes to better comply with AED, there will be an 18-month adjustment period starting from 1 April 2013 and ending on 30 September 2014.

Traders who are unable to comply with AED fully would generally not be penalised. However, their cargo would more likely be subjected to security checks, which may cause unnecessary delays.

Traders who do not make accurate AED submissions would generally not be penalised. This is provided that the submission is amended during the permit validity period. However, their cargo would more likely be checked.

To facilitate a smooth AED implementation on 1rd April 2013, a Part II email guideline for TradeNet users to cope up with the changes will be released in the near future.
